

WH Bradley Medal Nominations

The WH Bradley Medal is given to a limnogeologist who is outstanding in their field, shows dedication and service to the field of Limnogeology, and has contributed outstanding ideas and innovation to the field, including seminal publications.

The award is presented at the ILIC or joint IPA-IAL meeting. The first award was given to Kerry Kelts in 1999 and the list of other distinguished recipients are listed under the 'Awards' section on the IAL website.

The IAL board would like to solicit your nominations for the next Bradley medal winner. The next deadline for nominations is January 2021. The winner does not need to be a member of IAL. The nomination will consist of a letter (limit 5 pages) outlining the contributions of the nominee to 1) the science of limnogeology, 2) service to limnogeology and 3) a brief description of why this work is important to limnogeology and science in general. In addition a CV (no more than 20 pages) that outlines the important features that contribute to the work listed in the letter is required. For example, the committee is not interested in the number of grants and how much money they contribute to their research, but the committee is interested in the mentoring of young scientists (students at all levels and younger faculty and researchers) and how the research conducted by the nominee is important to limnogeology.
